pitch: How high or low a musical sound (tone) is.

meter: A <u>number</u> (usually at the beginning of the music) that tells you <u>how many beats are in each measure</u>.

*The 'meter' is the top number of the time signature.

rubric: A score card. Tells you what you need to know or show in order to get a certain grade.

projection: Singing, or talking, <u>loud</u> enough for the audience to hear.

diction: Singing, or speaking, <u>clearly</u> so that the audience can <u>understand</u> what is <u>being sung</u> (or said).


tone quality:


(Tone = sound. Quality = good or bad.)
Trying to make your best possible sound.

lyrics: Words to a song or poem.

posture: Position of your body. Singing = tall and proud, shoulders relaxed and arms at your sides.
