Vocabulary

pitch: How high or low a musical sound (*tone*) is.

meter: A number (usually at the beginning of the music) that tells you how many beats are in each measure.

**The 'meter' is the top number of the time signature.*

rubric: A score card. Tells you what you need to know or show in order to get a certain grade.

projection: Singing, or talking, loud enough for the audience to hear.

diction: Singing, or speaking, clearly so that the audience can understand what is being sung (or said).

tone quality:

(Tone = sound. Quality = good or bad.)

Trying to make your best possible sound.

lyrics: Words to a song or poem.

posture: Position of your body. Singing = tall and proud, shoulders relaxed and arms at your sides.
